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## Day wise program structure

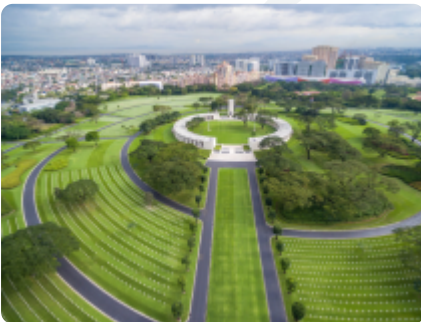

### Day 01 — Arrival in Manila, Airport Pick-up and Hotel Check-in, World War 2 memorial

Accommodation: Manila

Meals Included: Dinner

- Welcome to Manila, the “Pearl of the Orient,” a vibrant gateway to the Philippines’ stunning islands, pristine beaches, and remarkable natural wonders. This bustling metropolis blends centuries of history with modern life. Spanish colonial architecture stands alongside contemporary skyscrapers, reflecting a city that is both timeless and dynamic.
- A visit to the World War II Memorial for the Fallen Heroes offers a solemn pause amid the city’s energy. Set on peaceful, beautifully kept grounds, the memorial honors thousands of soldiers who fought bravely in the Pacific theater.
- Manila’s streets and markets then unfold with sights, sounds, and aromas that capture the essence of local life. Cultural landmarks, museums, and centuries-old churches reveal the depth of the nation’s heritage. By evening, the city pulses with lively nightlife, contemporary dining, and entertainment.

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## Day 02 — Flight to Cebu, Magellan's cross, Santo Niño Basilica, San Pedro Fort & Ferry to Bohol

Accommodation: Panglao - Bohol

Meals Included: Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner

- Arrive in Cebu by flight(≈1hour) and be welcomed by the CHT ground handling team at Mactan-Cebu International Airport. Begin the city's historical exploration with a visit to Magellan's Cross, a wooden landmark believed to have been planted by Portuguese explorer Ferdinand Magellan in 1521, symbolizing the introduction of Christianity to the Philippines.
- Continue to the Basilica Minore del Santo Niño, a Roman Catholic basilica built in 1565, renowned for housing the revered Santo Niño de Cebu, a treasured icon of faith and devotion. The journey then proceeds to Fort San Pedro, a Spanish colonial fort constructed in 1738 to safeguard the island from pirates and invaders.
- In the afternoon, transfer from Cebu to Bohol by ferry (≈2 hours). Upon arrival, the CHT ground crew will assist with onward transfers to Panglao Island, where the day concludes with check-in and the promise of exploring the island's pristine beaches and natural wonders.

## Day 03 — Sardine run at Napaling Reef, Loboc River Cruise, Tarsier Sanctuary & Chocolate Hills

Accommodation: Panglao - Bohol

Meals Included: Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner

- Napaling Reef, on the northern side of Panglao Island, offers a breathtaking encounter with the sardine run. Thousands of sardines glide in mesmerizing, synchronized patterns beneath the water's surface. The best viewing is between 6:00 AM and 10:00 AM. A GoPro is recommended to capture this spectacular underwater display.
- Embark on a traditional Loboc River cruise. Guests enjoy a buffet lunch while drifting past enchanting tropical forests, towering coconut palms, and serene mangroves, immersing in the island's lush landscape.
- In the afternoon, visit the Bohol Tarsier Conservation Area to observe the Philippine Tarsier (*Carlito syrichta*), one of the world's smallest primates. *Visitors are reminded to respect conservation rules: no touching, loud noises, or flash photography.*

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- The day culminates at the iconic Chocolate Hills, where, in the dry season, the grass turns brown to reveal hundreds of symmetrical mounds resembling chocolate. Each hill rises 30-50 meters, and the viewing decks offer panoramic vistas, accessible via a few stairs.

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## Day 04 — Balicasag Island, Bohol - Siquijor Ferry

Accommodation: Siquijor

Meals Included: Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner

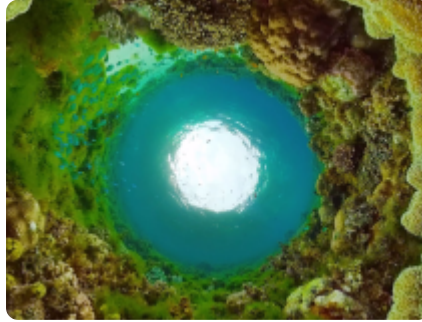
- This morning, the journey begins with a boat ride from Panglao, gliding past playful dolphins and glimpses of other marine life.
- Arrive at Balicasag Island, a protected marine sanctuary where coral gardens flourish in a kaleidoscope of colors. Schools of tropical fish — clownfish, parrotfish, lionfish, butterflyfish, and jackfish — dart through crystal waters, while gentle sea turtles glide gracefully along seagrass meadows. On the southeast side, Turtle Point offers an unforgettable chance to witness these serene creatures in their natural habitat.
- In the afternoon, sail back to Tagbilaran Port and board an OceanJet ferry to Siquijor (≈2 hours). Upon arrival, transfer to the hotel for check-in and enjoy a leisurely evening on this enchanted island.

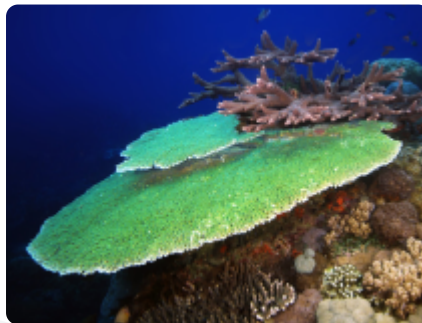

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## Day 05 — Siquijor Island exploration & ferry to Dumaguete

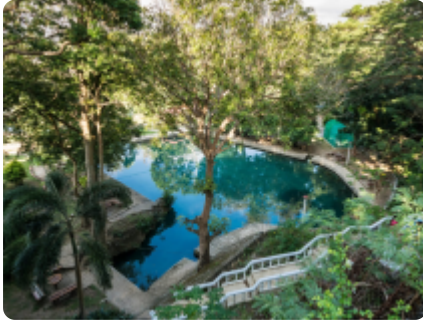
Accommodation: Dumaguete

Meals Included: Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner

- A full day of exploration unfolds on Siquijor, the “Island of Fire,” famed for its pristine beaches, waterfalls, and mystical folklore.
- Capilay Spring Park: A morning dip in the cool, spring-fed waters sets a refreshing start to the day.
- Tubod Beach: Stroll along the turquoise shores and enjoy the peaceful ambiance of this quiet beach.
- Lugnason Falls: A hidden jungle cascade plunges into a natural pool, perfect for a refreshing swim.
- Old Enchanted Balete Tree: The 400+-year-old Balete tree stands as a living legend, with a spring-fed fish spa at its base.
- Lazi Convent: Explore one of Asia’s largest Spanish colonial convents, with coral-stone foundations, hardwood upper floors, and a museum revealing Siquijor’s religious heritage.
- Kagusuan Beach: A secluded coastal retreat, ideal for a gentle walk along soft sand and listening to the waves.
- Cambugahay Falls: A three-tiered waterfall of turquoise pools framed by lush greenery, offering swimming, rope swings, and cliff-jumping opportunities for the adventurous.
- The day concludes with a short ferry ride to Dumaguete (≈40 minutes) for an overnight stay.

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## **Day 06 — Ferry to Liloan (Santander), Oslob, Tumalog Falls, Cebu City**

Accommodation: Cebu

Meals Included: Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner

- Early morning ferry from Dumaguete delivers the group to Liloan Port in Santander, southern Cebu. A scenic drive along the eastern coast leads to Oslob, where the gentle giants of the sea await.
- Whale sharks glide beneath the surface, observed from traditional outrigger boats (Bancas) that drift silently above clear waters. Trained guides ensure respectful, eco-conscious encounters as the majestic creatures feed on plankton and krill, offering a rare glimpse into one of the ocean's largest fish species.
- A visit to Tumalog Falls provides a serene contrast — a cascading curtain of turquoise water set amid lush tropical vegetation, perfect for a refreshing dip. Lunch follows, then the journey continues to Cebu City for an overnight stay.

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## **Day 07 — Flight to Manila, Binondo Chinatown, Jones Bridge, Intramuros & Okada Fountains**

Accommodation: Manila

Meals Included: Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner

- Flight to Manila.
- Begin a tour of the historic Chinatown, recorded as the first in the world (established 1594), wandering through alleyways alive with bustling commercial activity. This district, also known as Binondo, exudes a vibrant blend of culture, history, and cuisine.
- The Binondo Church, a minor basilica and the national shrine of St. Lorenzo Ruiz, stands as a symbol of faith and devotion.
- The famed Binondo Food Crawl along Ongpin Street offers a flavorful immersion into local culinary traditions.
- A walk over Jones Bridge connects Chinatown with Intramuros, the walled city built by Spanish colonizers in 1521. The bridge, constructed in the 1910s to replace the historic Bridge of Spain (Puente de España), was opened to the public in 1921. The original structure was destroyed during the Battle of Manila in February 1945 by retreating Japanese troops and later rebuilt.
- Within Intramuros, Fort Santiago houses the imprisonment site of national hero José Rizal, while the San Agustin Church, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, stands as the only building to survive the Battle of Manila.
- The Manila Cathedral, a minor basilica inside Intramuros, has been destroyed and rebuilt eight times, reflecting the city's enduring spirit.

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- Conclude the day at Okada Manila at sunset, where the world's largest multicolored dancing fountains captivate with a spectacular choreography of water, light, and sound — a truly unforgettable finale to the journey.

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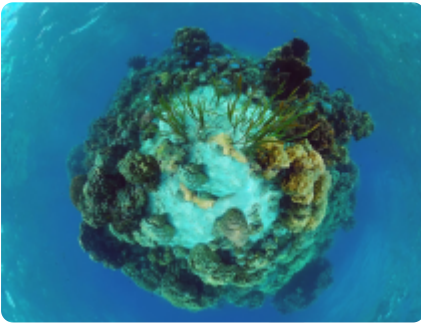

Know more about this tour

### What are the travel requirements?

- Passport valid for at least 6 months from the start date of the tour.
- Philippines allow visa free entry for tourists from most countries. Please refer to the Philippine Visa Policy for various nationalities [here](#).
- Health insurance valid for the duration of the journey, preferably "cash free" policies.
- Electronic Travel Authorization is required for boarding a flight to the Philippines. Please register 72 hours before the flight [here](#).

### Who can travel?

- Adult passengers from most countries.
- Minors must be accompanied by an immediate relative/guardian.

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### **What is the best period to travel to the Philippines?**

The ideal time to explore the Philippines is from November to June, when the weather is generally dry and pleasant. From July to October, rain showers and the occasional Pacific typhoon are more likely, but travelers may enjoy lower rates and smaller crowds during this off-peak season.

### **Are credit cards accepted in the Philippines?**

Yes, credit cards are widely accepted in the Philippines, especially in major cities and popular tourist areas. However, cash remains the primary method of payment in many locations, particularly in rural or remote regions, so it is advisable to carry Philippine Pesos for purchases at such sites.

### **Can cash be carried into the Philippines?**

Travelers may bring up to PHP 50,000 in Philippine Pesos and up to USD 10,000 (or equivalent) in foreign currency without special permission. Amounts exceeding USD 10,000 must be declared on a Foreign Currency Declaration Form (e-CDF) to the Bureau of Customs (BOC) upon arrival. Failure to declare large sums can result in confiscation and penalties. [Read more...](#)
